

Art/DT

- The children will learn about the life of the painter Lowry. They will learn to paint in his style, including using the three primary colours to colour mix and create a collaborative piece of art.
- To create art in nature in the style of Andy Goldsworthy.

Humanities

- In Geography the children will learn about the local area. They will learn to read a map. Understand how to use a key, identify local land uses and go on field trips to explore our local area.
- In History, the children will learn about the Romans, aspects of how they lived and how it affected the way we live today.

Outdoor Learning

- Use the outside environment to solve problems and participate in group tasks to improve speaking and listening skills and develop confidence.
- Investigate the mini-beasts living in the school grounds and the food chains they are part of.

Literacy

- Read Write Inc phonics practise.
- Describe the setting and characters in Mairi Hederwick's Katie Morag stories, write questions for Katie Morag, write a book review and create their own story.
- Exploring thoughts and feelings towards the poem The House that Once Was, identifying rhyme and how language can be used to evoke emotions.
- Become familiar with a variety of Beatrix Potter stories, discuss and answer questions, explore the story using drama and write a blurb.

PE- Cricket

- Practise fielding, bowling and batting techniques.
- Develop coordination and the ability to throw and catch a ball accurately.

PSHE

- To continue being aware of our Zones of Regulation and how we all use them to help us.

Science - Rocks

- The children will learn about natural and human-made rocks.
