English

In English the children will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of grammar, punctuation and spelling and have opportunities to apply this learning in their writing. We will be looking at text genre, including fiction, poetry and reports.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, the Lapwing Class topic will be "Animals, Including Humans." The children will look at how a variety of animals aet the nutrients they need to stay healthy. We will look at the different food groups and use our knowledge to design healthy, balanced and nutritious meals. The children will also investigate the bodies of different animals. including humans. They will learn to name and identify different parts of animal skeletons and discover their functions. The children will go on to compare different animal skeletons and consider how they meet these functions, purposes. Following this, the children will learn about muscles and movement, finding out how muscles work. During this topic, the class will also have opportunities to make predictions, gather data and to discuss and interpret their findings

Ar

In Art this term we will be learning about portraits and making them using a variety of media. We will also be creating portraits in the style of Pablo Picasso.

PE

In PE our focus will be gymnastics.
Children will work on different

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<u>RE</u>

In RE the Lapwings Class will be learning about Judaism. We will be looking at Jewish celebrations and festivals such as Yom Kippur, Hanukkah and Rosh Hashanah.

Throughout the term the children will use programmes develop their skills to present work from other curriculum areas, such as editing the colour, size and type of font and copying and pasting pictures from the internet. There will also be opportunities for the children to use the internet for research.
