Always good to start with sharing some good news. The Love Northumberland Awards were hosted at The Alnwick Garden. The village Trail project undertaken by last year's Y6 pupils, won the Best Children's Project category. Lillie and Luke from the School Council, with 2 Governors, Mrs Dunn and Mr Lee were there to receive the award from the Duchess of Northumberland.

In the same week, Allendale Primary School was awarded the Gold School Games Mark for our work to increase sporting opportunities and participation.

Well done to the Y6 football team whom Mr Charlton took to Hexham Middle School to compete in an inter-schools tournament. They won 3, lost 1 and finished 3rd overall.

10 Y6 children and Mr Charlton have made a very early start today, as they have been invited to attend a Young Ambassadors sporting event at Durham University.

Tomorrow, 42 children from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6, will be representing Allendale Primary in a North East Region team cross country event at The Gateshead Stadium. Cross Country is not everyone's favourite event but we're very proud that so many of the children are willing to represent the school team. Hopefully they will have a fantastic day and enjoy the experience.

Parents Evenings:

Parents Evenings will take place on **Wednesday 21st October** and **Thursday 22nd October**; we have had to move it from Monday 19th due to staff training commitments. You should have received a form to opt for your preferred day and time with this newsletter. A hard copy has been sent for those parents who receive an e-mailed newsletter. Those parents with more than one child in school will be given times close together.

School Site:

Staff are becoming increasingly concerned about the numbers of parents parking in the bus pull in outside school or on the yellow zig-zag lines opposite school. This is potentially dangerous as children are alighting the buses and crossing in front of cars or children being dropped off by car are passing behind or in front of buses. Also parents and children are requested not to walk across the bus park whilst the buses are entering and exiting in the morning and after school. We encourage pedestrians to walk along the footpath to the road and cross directly opposite the park. I have been in contact with the programme officer at Highways but at the moment NCC seem reluctant to do anything about the traffic situation outside school.

The school site is private property. Whilst the Sports Hall is in use every night, children should not go onto the playground or field to play. We do not want any further damage.

Lastly, the top field is being developed as a wildlife area; however, it is used for cross country and outdoor learning sessions. Someone is walking their dog there, leaving some very undesirable deposits which are deeply unpleasant for children and staff to be working around. If you see anyone using this to walk their dog, please tell us!
