### **Sports News:**

We're pleased that Mr Rickett's will be back with us this year. He will be teaching P.E on Monday mornings, starting with Kestrel, Curlew and Lapwing Classes this half term.

At the end of the Summer term, we were again awarded the School Games Gold Award; last year we were one of only 14 First / Primary schools in Northumberland to achieve Gold, so we are very proud of the range of physical activities on offer.

### **Reading:**

The Accelerated Reader Programme is in the process of being introduced in Lapwing, Curlew and Kestrel Classes. The children have all taken the on-line assessment which has given a levelled range of books for each child to choose within. Once the book has been read, your child will take a quiz about the book, with questions focusing on the content, understanding and vocabulary. It is recommended that the children read books at the beginning of this range to start with, so your child's reading book may look far too easy at first; please don't be concerned about this as the information gained from the quizzes will inform the class teacher when to move along the range. We will be holding a parents information session about this on **Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> September at 6pm.**

When the children start in Reception Class, they are given a reading folder free of charge. We provide these to keep reading books and reading records, spelling booklets, homework etc. safely stored so they don't get damaged or lost at home or in class. Children should continue to use their reading folder until at least the end of Year 4; there is no need for parents to buy bags especially for reading books as we do not have the room to store bulky bags in the classrooms as they don't fit in the children's trays or reading folder boxes. Children are very welcome to bring their reading folder in a school bag which can be hung on their peg / stored in their locker.

### **Uniform:**

School uniform and school PE kit is available to order from Mrs Clarke in the school office. Uniform should be named which would reduce the contents of the lost property box! Our uniform policy is available on our website; just to remind parents that trainers are not allowed as footwear, jewellery, other than plain studs for those children with pierced ears, is not to be worn in school, (watches are allowed), and tram lines should not be shaved into hair.

### **Year 6 Residential:**

This year we are taking Y6 to Lockerbie Manor in Scotland for an action packed residential in May. There will be a representative from Lockerbie Manor coming to talk to parents about the venue and activities on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> September at 6.00pm.**

**Allstars:**

Allstars is run by school and offers affordable before and after school childcare. It is not run for profit but must break even as we cannot afford to subsidise it from the school budget, therefore we need parents to use it, regularly or occasionally. Breakfast Club opens at 8.00am, after school runs to 5.30pm Monday to Thursday and 4.30pm on a Friday.
