


French

With Mrs Hawkins, the class will continue to build their French vocabulary. They will practise their conversations with one another and use songs to aid their memory and pronunciation.

Science

In Science, the Curlew Class topic will be **"States of Matter."** We will be undertaking a variety of experiments which look at the states of matter. We will be recording our results carefully before presenting out findings using graphs and tables. We will be working on making our tests 'fair' and will be developing our own ideas for future investigations.



Art

In Art this term we will be using our Rainforest and Native American's topic to inspire our art, using a variety of different media.

PE

In PE our focus will be tag-rugby and the School Games multi-skills competition, involving coordination, agility, strength and balance activities. We will also be taking part in cross-country running.

Music

The class will be using Charanga to develop musical awareness, focussing on the rhythm and pulse in the music. We will put this into practice using glockenspiels and the steel pans.

Topic

Our topics this term will be **The Rainforest** and **Native Americans**.

Firstly we will investigate the diversity within the rainforest and learn about the different layers within it. We will also find out about the people who live there and compare the weather to that of the UK. When studying the Native Americans, we will learn about their history, their dwellings and the ways that they lived.

Curlew Class Curriculum Information

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RE

In RE the Curlew Class will be learning about Judaism. We will be learning about symbols and their importance to Jewish people as well as looking at their customs and places of worship.

Computing

Here, our focus of study will be **"Staying Safe Online."** The children will learn to recognise cyberbullying and what to do if they encounter it. They will learn about privacy settings, creating strong passwords, and how to safely send and receive emails. Children will also consider the differences between commuting in real life and online. Throughout the term the children will use programmes develop their skills to present work from other curriculum areas, such as editing the colour, size and type of font and copying and pasting pictures from the internet. There will also be opportunities for the children to use the internet for research.
